    - **WORLD CHAMPION BONUSES:**
      - ALL-AROUND WORLD CHAMPION - \$20,000
      - DISCIPLINE WORLD CHAMPIONS (PRO/CHL) - \$5,000 (per discipline)
  - **WCRA NOMINATIONS:** athletes are eligible to nominate their competitive efforts toward the WCRA Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) for Segment W24 Leaderboards until April 14, 2024 at 11:59pm CT.
  - **ELIGIBLE ATHLETES:**
    - Athletes are required to have a minimum of fifteen (15) VRQ points on the WCRA W24 leaderboard in a discipline to be eligible to enter WRWC. Athletes without the minimum VRQ points will be eligible to enter as an alternate but are not guaranteed to compete and may be subject to penalty fees.
    - All Disciplines: up to the Top 20 from WCRA Segment W24 Leaderboard will be eligible to participate at WRWC.
      - Leaderboard #1 Athlete (PRO/CHL) in Segment W24 will be seeded in Showdown Round and is eligible, but not required, to participate in the Qualifying Rounds for payout and points.
      - Leaderboard #2-4 Athletes (PRO/CHL) in Segment W24 will be seeded in Semi-Final Round and is eligible, but not required, to participate in the Qualifying Rounds for payout and points.
      - Seeded athletes in each discipline will be required to notify [eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com](mailto:eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com) at the time of entry to declare whether or not they will be competing in the Qualifying Rounds.
    - WRWC reserves the right to add additional athletes via a generic qualification from select association or series leaderboards to participate in the event. Any such case may or may not be promoted to the public outside of the association/series marketing campaigns.
    - **ENTRY FEES:** Complimentary entry fees for all eligible athletes
  - **ADVANCEMENT TO SHOWDOWN ROUND – 12 athletes from the combined leaderboards**
    - W24 Leaderboard #1 (PRO)

    - Fastest Time from Semi-Final Round (PRO)

  - Barrel Racing will not be included in the Showdown Round of competition, athletes will advance directly to Triple Crown of Rodeo Round.
  - Last Chance Qualifier – Athletes may nominate the maximum number of times they are entered in the Cowgirl Gathering. The highest placing Pro and Challenger not already competing in WRWC will advance.
  - **EVENT FORMAT:** Leaderboards ran separately through the Semi-Final Round.

- 2.4. WRWC Showdown Round
- 2.5. WRWC Triple Crown of Rodeo Round

**3. GENERAL GROUND RULES**

- 3.1. The Women's Rodeo World Championship (WRWC) is open to all biological female athletes over the age of thirteen (13) years of age at the time of entry.
- 3.2. WRWC is part of the WCRA Triple Crown of Rodeo (TCR). The WRWC event will count in the consecutive event count for athletes in Breakaway Roping, Barrel Racing and Team Roping.
  - 3.2.1. If a female athlete has earned a TCR win at a previous event(s) in the Team Roping, they must participate and win the WRWC event to continue the consecutive event wins toward the TCR bonus.
  - 3.2.2. The WRWC event will not count against male athletes that have earned a TCR win at a previous event(s).
  - 3.2.3. Following the WRWC, there is a possibility that two (2) Team Roping Headers and two (2) Team Roping Heelers will hold a TCR event win going into the next scheduled TCR event.
- 3.3. WRWC DISCIPLINES: Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Breakaway Roping, Barrel Racing
- 3.4. Definition: the term "Leaderboard" or "Leaderboards", when not accompanied by a "Pro", "Challenger", or "Pro/CHL" designation, refers to the W24 Leaderboard applicable to the athlete's competition classification.
  - 3.4.1. The abbreviation "CHL" refers to the Challenger classification
- 3.5. Athletes are allowed one (1) entry per discipline in the 2024 WRWC event.
  - 3.5.1. For avoidance of doubt, the separation of PRO/CHL leaderboards does not constitute or create separate disciplines.
  - 3.5.2. Athletes seeded in the Showdown Round (Pro/CHL Leaderboard #1) are eligible to participate in the Qualifying Rounds payout, World points and All Around points.
- 3.6. To ensure fair and safe competition, the WRWC Competition Committee reserves the right to modify these ground rules whether by addition to, deletion from, or modification of any rules as it deems necessary, without prior notice.
  - 3.6.1. Any requests for rule changes or modifications must be submitted to the WRWC Competition Committee, who will then review and approve prior to enforcing any rule modifications or edits.
  - 3.6.2. No rule changes will be made within a round of competition.
- 3.7. For clarification, any reference to WRWC W24 leaderboard standings as it relates to tie-breakers or similar instances, the leaderboard standings refer to the final audited standings as of April 18, 2024.
- 3.8. COVID and General Health Compliance:
  - 3.8.1. The safety of WRWC athletes, production crew, event staff, venue staff, exhibitors, spectators and everyone in the execution of this event is WRWC staff's top priority.

- 3.8.2. WRWC may implement safety guidelines based on recommendations from Federal, State, and Local officials along with the host venues protocols in place at the time of the event. Safety guidelines will be provided to all participants (athletes, staff, etc.) prior to the start of the event.
- 3.8.3. The Competition Committee reserves the right to follow up on any information received that an athlete may be experiencing adverse health conditions that could compromise the health of other people. Pending the verification of this information, the Competition Committee may take the appropriate measures it deems necessary to ensure the safety of all participants, personnel, and spectators of the event. These measures may range from added safety protocols to be exercised by the appropriate parties up to the removal of an athlete from the event.
- 3.9. Definition: For avoidance of doubt and clarification as it applies to the WRWC Triple Crown of Rodeo round payout, the following defines the difference between an Event Champion and an Event Winner.
- 3.9.1. An Event Champion is a Contestant/Team that has recorded the fastest time in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round **and** has placed first in the final event results of her discipline solely by herself. To be an Event Champion, Contestant/Team must meet all WRWC eligibility requirements. Contestants/Teams with tied times in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round are not considered Event Champions. An Event Champion **is** eligible to earn the top payout in their discipline.
- 3.9.2. An Event Winner has not posted a qualified time in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round **and/or** has not placed first in the final results of her discipline solely by herself but rather is in a tied situation for first. Event Winners **have not** met the minimum WRWC requirements and are **NOT** eligible to earn the top payout in their discipline.
- 3.10. Splits:
- 3.10.1. All timed event splits must be declared one hour before the event start time. Changes in splits in subsequent rounds of competition must be declared immediately following the previous round of competition.
- 3.11. **Draw Outs:**
- 3.11.1. If an athlete draws out of the event prior to the entries closing or is drawn out after the books close, but prior to competing in the event, for a valid reason, the athlete will be refunded the full amount of entry fees pre-paid for the event competition position vacated.
- 3.11.1.1. Transaction fees related to an entry fee are not refundable for any reason.
- 3.11.1.2. Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) nomination and transaction fees are not refundable for any reason after the segment has closed.
- 3.12. **Turn Outs and Non-Entries:**
- 3.12.1. If an eligible athlete qualified via the W24 Leaderboard does not enter during the designated entry time period, they will be replaced by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
- 3.12.2. If an eligible athlete qualified via the W24 Leaderboard draws out of the event before entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
- 3.12.3. If an eligible athlete qualified via the W24 Leaderboard turns out of the event after entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate.
- 3.12.3.1. The penalty for a notified turnout is \$500.00 or forfeiture of all entry fees, whichever is greater.
- 3.12.3.2. The penalty for a non-notified turnout is \$500.00 plus forfeiture of all entry fees and/or applicable stock charges associated with the entry.
- 3.12.3.2.1. The athlete will not be allowed to earn a competition position at the event in the same discipline via alternate qualifying methods.
- 3.12.4. If an athlete chooses not to participate for a “non- injury” related reason in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round, they will be assessed a penalty for a notified turnout in the amount of \$1,000.00. The penalty for a notified turnout after the turnout deadline or a non-notified turnout is \$1,000.00 plus any applicable entry fees and/or stock charges associated with the entry.
- 3.12.4.1. Turnout Deadline – 24 hours prior to the posted performance start time of the event.
- 3.12.4.2. If an athlete turns out after the deadline, but before 18 hours of the posted performance time and a replacement participates in their place, the additional fees will be waived above the \$1,000 penalty.
- 3.12.5. Any athlete who incurs a fine for a turnout or non-notified turnout, the athlete will have the option to pay the fine or be ineligible to participate in the WCRA platform for a minimum of the next WCRA segment and up to a maximum one (1) calendar year. The athlete will also forfeit any and all fees or payments made in relation to the ineligible WCRA segment.
- 3.12.5.1. The ineligible period will be determined by the WCRA Competition Committee and an event Promoter Representative.
- 3.12.6. **Turn Out Due to Doctor Release:** Athlete must give notice to Event Arena Secretary no later than 3 days before his/her scheduled Performance, or upon the occurrence of a physical injury if it occurs less than 3 days before the Performance. In order to be eligible to be Excused, the Athlete must provide, prior to Athlete’s first scheduled competition time, a written medical doctor verification on doctor’s letterhead bearing the doctor’s

name, address and phone number, signed by a licensed doctor explaining the injury and recommending that the Athlete not compete in the Event. The doctor's note must be dated no later than 3 days after the alleged injury occurred.

3.12.7. **Turn Out Due to Visible Injury:** An Athlete may turn out due to visible injury, provided notification of such a turn out is authorized by official Event Sports Medicine trainer or Event doctor at Event.

3.12.8. **Turn Out Due to Vet Releases:** Vet releases will only be accepted in the Barrel Racing Discipline and must be on signed letterhead from a licensed veterinarian.

3.12.9. **Non-Notified Turn Out:** Any athlete that is a Non-Notified Turn Out in a round competition will be also being listed as a Turn Out for all subsequent rounds of competition included any earned Advancement or Seeded rounds.

3.12.9.1. Athletes that have earned an advancing position to a subsequent round of competition and opt to skip additional qualifying rounds must notify WCRA of their intention not to participate in the remaining Qualifying Rounds of competition.

3.12.9.2. Seeded Athletes that opt out of an eligible round of competition must notify WCRA of their intention not to participate in the early rounds of competition.

3.12.10. In the Team Roping, if a header or heeler notifies TO, NNTD, VIR, DR, or DO leaving an incomplete team, the next Athlete in the corresponding category (header or heeler) will be added to the team. If an alternate is not found prior to the Athlete's competition time, the remaining partner may select another partner from among any of the Event Athletes already entered in Event, except those scheduled to compete in that same Discipline that have not already entered the maximum allowed times.

3.12.11. Other: WRWC Competition Committee may Excuse an Athlete from competing in a Performance, staying at the Performance for the designated times, or otherwise altering the terms of the Athlete Agreement, but only in its sole and absolute discretion.

### 3.13. Trades

3.13.1. The WRWC W24 event format negates the need for any trades.

3.13.2. If for any reason, more than one arena is required for competition, all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure athletes participating in multiple disciplines will not have overlapping runs. If this issue occurs the athlete must notify the event secretary in advance of the event. The WRWC Competition Committee will evaluate how to resolve the issue, if possible.

### 3.14. Timing & Scoring

3.14.1. Times in the Team Roping and Breakaway Roping will be recorded to the hundredths of a second.

3.14.1.1. Competition will start behind a rope barrier and will be timed by handheld plungers from the PBR Scoring System.

3.14.2. Barrel Racing times will be recorded to the thousandths of a second by electronic eyes. Dual timer eyes will be used. One set of timer eyes will be the primary recorded time. The secondary timer eyes will be the first back up time used.

3.14.3. If backup times from stopwatches are required to be used at any time during the event competition a minimum of two (2) handheld stopwatches will be used and averaged to record times to:

3.14.3.1. Team Roping and Breakaway Roping – the tenths of a second.

3.14.3.2. Barrel Racing – the hundredths of a second.

### 3.15. Stock Draw

3.15.1. Stock will be drawn at least two hours prior to the start of the competition.

3.15.2. The stock will be drawn in order of the athlete's W24 Leaderboard ranking per round/performance in the Qualifying Rounds and Semi-Finals Round.

3.15.2.1. Semi-Finals Round stock will be the fastest times from the Qualifying Rounds.

3.15.2.2. TCR Round and Showdown Round stock will be from the fastest runs from the combined PRO Qualifying Rounds and PRO Semi-Finals Round.

3.15.2.2.1. TCR Round stock will be from the top three (3) fastest runs in the PRO Semi-Finals Round. The next fastest runs from the combined PRO Qualifying Rounds and PRO Semi-Finals Round will be used in the Showdown Round inclusive of two (2) extras.

3.15.2.2.2. Barrier Penalties will not be included when determining stock with fastest times for advancement rounds.

3.15.3. If there are not enough animals to complete a round of competition, re-run stock will be drawn as needed.

3.15.4. Athletes may not draw the same competition animal within a sequence of competition with multiple rounds that may or may include an aggregate component such as the Qualifying Rounds and Semi-Final Round.

3.15.5. An Athlete may draw a competition animal that they have previously competed on during the event based on the following:

3.15.5.1. The animal is not redrawn during a segment of the competition that includes an aggregate.



- 3.15.5.2. The athlete redraws the competition animal in a subsequent round or set of rounds during the event that starts as a clean slate.
- 3.15.5.3. PRO and Challengers Leaderboard Qualifying Rounds will use separate herds of animals. Once the leaderboards merge in the subsequent rounds the animals with the fastest times PRO Qualifying Rounds will be used.
- 3.15.6. TCR Round – The stock will be drafted 2 hours prior to the performance posted start time at the rodeo secretary office. Draft will be in order of advancement with fastest time/highest score drafting first.
- 3.15.7. If a timed event animal escapes, or a re-run is due for any other reason during a performance, the extra will be used. Only escaped animals go back into the herd.
- 3.15.8. Misdraw procedure will be determined by the event officials.
- 3.16. PRO and CHALLENGER LEADERBOARDS
  - 3.16.1. WRWC will include PRO and CHALLENGER Leaderboards in the WRWC Qualifying Rounds and Semi-Final Round for each discipline.
  - 3.16.2. An athlete's eligibility to participate in the Challenger Leaderboard will be determined based on known information and updated quarterly. Athlete earnings in GBR and BAW will be reviewed at the end of each yearly quarter to verify classification status. If an athlete is promoted out of the Challenger Leaderboard, the athlete's total points and any Qualifier Series generic qualifications in that discipline will be moved to the PRO Leaderboard. Team Ropers will be required to show proof of their classification. Any roper classified as a #4.5 or less is eligible to compete as a Challenger.
  - 3.16.3. The WRWC Competition Committee reserves the right to verify or reclassify any classification based on known information.
    - 3.16.3.1. Challenger Athlete Classification updates will be made based on data available as of the following date:
      - 3.16.3.1.1. January 15, 2024
    - 3.16.3.2. Following the classification update - Athletes will be promoted from the Challenger to PRO leaderboard if they exceed the earning or number guidelines for Challengers.
      - 3.16.3.2.1. An athlete's points following the final leaderboard audit will determine their competition position per the event ground rules.
    - 3.16.3.3. Challenger eligible athletes will have the opportunity to choose the leaderboard on which they would like to compete by emailing [classification@rodeologistics.co](mailto:classification@rodeologistics.co). New athletes on the W24 Leaderboard will have fourteen (14) days from the date of their first nomination in a discipline to declare their classification. Once the declaration deadline has expired the athlete is no longer eligible to change leaderboard designations. If an athlete does not declare their intent toward either leaderboard within the 14 day declaration window, they will be automatically classified as a PRO athlete in that discipline.
  - 3.16.3.4. Challenger Leaderboard qualification eligibility:
    - 3.16.3.4.1. Team Roping – Global Handicaps, Wrangler Team Roping, ACTRA or another approved classification system will be used to determine Challenger Leaderboard eligibility. Athlete's must provide their highest rated membership card for classification and may not exceed a number of #4.5. All athletes must provide a current registration for official athlete number ranking.
      - 3.16.3.4.1.1. Team Roping athletes must send an electronic copy or screenshot of their 2024 Global Handicap (or another approved ranking system) rating to verify their number ranking. Athletes will be defaulted to the PRO Leaderboard until verification is provided. The screenshot must be sent to [classification@rodeologistics.co](mailto:classification@rodeologistics.co) (this is not a .com email address)
      - 3.16.3.4.1.2. Athletes may submit a Team Roping classification request [HERE](#)
    - 3.16.3.4.2. Barrel Racing – Equistat ranking system will be used to determine Challenger Leaderboard eligibility. The Equistat database currently includes over 76,600 Barrel Racing athletes. Athletes are eligible to participate in the Challenger Leaderboard if their earnings do not exceed the Lifetime earnings amount or the amount listed below in any one (1) calendar year for any of the defined time periods in this section.
      - 3.16.3.4.2.1. 2024 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.2. 2023 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.3. 2022 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.4. 2021 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.5. 2020 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.6. 2019 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.7. 2018 calendar year - \$20,000
      - 3.16.3.4.2.8. Lifetime Earnings - \$100,000

3.16.3.4.3. Breakaway Roping – Rodeo Logistics Athlete Classification (RLAC) is a proprietary rankings format developed by Rodeo Logistics and based on athlete earnings derived from select national and regional rodeo associations; select stand-alone events; WRWC events, and WCRA earnings from the 2018-2024 calendar years. The RLAC database currently includes over 2,300 Breakaway Roping athletes. Athletes are eligible to participate in the Challenger Leaderboard if their earnings do not exceed the Lifetime earnings amount or the amount listed below in any one (1) calendar year for any of the defined time periods in this section.

- 3.16.3.4.3.1. 2024 calendar year - \$10,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.2. 2023 calendar year - \$10,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.3. 2022 calendar year - \$10,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.4. 2021 calendar year - \$6,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.5. 2020 calendar year - \$6,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.6. 2019 calendar year - \$6,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.7. 2018 calendar year - \$6,000
- 3.16.3.4.3.8. Lifetime Earnings - \$30,000

3.16.4. If an athlete is not included in any known data to establish their status, they will default to the PRO Leaderboard. Athletes will have the opportunity to provide information on their career stats and earnings to the WRWC Competition Committee to apply for Challenger status.

3.16.4.1. The WRWC Competition Committee reserves the right to reclassify any athlete at any time

3.16.5. Athletes are eligible to participate in one (1) leaderboard per discipline at a time – Pro or Challenger.

3.16.5.1. An athlete may be eligible to participate as a Challenger in a discipline and as a Pro in another discipline.

3.16.5.1.1.1. Athletes may submit a Breakaway classification request [HERE](#)

#### 4. BARREL RACING GENERAL RULES

4.1. To limit the number of runs on a horse, barrel racing will not be included in the Showdown Round. Advancement from the Qualifying Round is directly to the Triple Crown of Rodeo round.

4.2. Athletes are not required to participate on the same horse and may choose to run a different horse in any round that they choose.

4.3. Barrel Racing Tractor Drag/Hand Rake

4.3.1. WRWC Qualifying Round (Pro & Challenger)

4.3.1.1. Tractor drag after every 4 runs and between each Leaderboard group

4.3.1.2. Hand rake after every run

4.3.2. WRWC Semi-Final Round

4.3.2.1. Tractor drag after every 4 runs

4.3.2.2. Hand rake after every run

4.3.3. WRWC Triple Crown of Rodeo Round

4.3.3.1. Tractor drag after every 4 runs

4.3.3.2. Hand rake after every run

4.3.4. Once competition has started, all athletes entered in a round of competition that vacate their competition position for any reason will remain in the draw for the purpose of competition positions between drags.

#### 5. TEAM ROPING PAIRING & LEADERBOARD RULES

5.1. At the conclusion of the segment cut off, all Headers and Heelers will first declare their partners via email prior to entries opening. A link to a live sheet will be shared with all header/heelers to see the pairings as they are sent in.

**5.1.1. Combined partner point totals after the pairing deadline will determine the team's competition placement within the WRWC Qualifying Rounds.**

5.1.1.1. All references to a Team Roping ranking and/or competition position once the pairings have been confirmed will be based on the combined team point total.

5.1.2. A deadline will be set and communicated to the athletes to confirm their partner.

**5.1.3. After the pairing deadline has closed, all teams are final.**

5.2. Once pairings are final, both team members must also enter the event through the NextGen entry application

5.3. Athletes are not allowed to have more than one (1) identical Header/Heeler pairing combination at any time during the event.

5.3.1. A paired combination must maintain the pairing during any advancement rounds the team has qualified to participate in or any re-enter rounds of competition the athletes are eligible to participate in as long as there are no identical team pairings participating in the event.

5.3.2. If a team member is unable to continue participating in the event after competition has started due to an injury or illness, the remaining team member may select a replacement partner from the remaining field of entered athletes that have not maxed out their entries in that discipline. The athlete turning out must provide verification of injury/illness prior to the new team pairing becoming valid.

5.4. Headers/Heelers competing in the WRWC Qualifying Rounds.

- 5.4.1. In the event there is an uneven number of headers/heelers, any vacancies will be filled with the eligible headers/heelers from the master athlete alternate list. WRWC will pair the remaining vacancies with the alternates in order of their W24 Leaderboard rank.
- 5.4.2. Once all alternates have been exhausted, the remaining headers/heelers without a partner will be allowed to choose a partner from the remaining field of entered athletes that have not maxed out their entries in that discipline.
- 5.4.3. Any athlete that was selected as Header or Heeler to fill a competition position that did not have a minimum of 15 VRQ points on the leaderboard for that discipline will be eligible for any competition prize money earned but will not be eligible for World or All Around points in that discipline.
- 5.5. WRWC Leaderboard (Pro and Challenger Leaderboards applied separately)
  - 5.5.1. Each eligible athlete's individual point total from the final audited WRWC W24 Leaderboard as of April 18, 2024 will determine qualification into the WRWC.
    - 5.5.1.1. W24 Pro/CHL Leaderboards (separately) - Headers and Heelers on the leaderboards will be eligible to participate in WRWC and will be eligible to pair with athletes in their respective round of competition prior to entry.
      - 5.5.1.1.1. Combined partner point totals after the pairing deadline will determine the team's competition placement in the WRWC Qualifying Rounds.
      - 5.5.1.1.2. The #1 team based on combined leaderboard points will be seeded into the WRWC Showdown Round. The #1 team will not be final until all teams have been paired. The #1 team based on combined leaderboard points is eligible to participate in the WRWC Qualifying Rounds with advancement to subsequent rounds based on competition performance, for payout, World points and All Around Championship points. If the #1 team earns an advancement position to the WRWC Showdown round the earned advancement position will be vacated and filled by the next eligible team based on the three run aggregate standings. The #1 team will participate in the round based on the earned seeded position.

## 6. WRWC ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1. At the close of WRWC Segment W24 (W24) on April 14, 2024, at 11:59:59pm, all female athletes 13 years of age or older are eligible in each discipline based on their WRWC W24 Leaderboard rank or generic qualifications.
  - 6.1.1. All athletes eligible to enter WRWC via the WRWC W24 Pro or Challenger Leaderboard or generic qualifications will be notified by WRWC via email and text with event entry details. The entry information will include what section of the competition the athlete will start their competition path. Seeded athletes will have the option to participate in earlier competition rounds, based on their leaderboard position, for prize money, World points and All Around points.
    - 6.1.1.1. All references to a Team Roping competition position will be based on the team's combined athlete W24 Leaderboard points total.
- 6.2. A master event athlete list of eligible athletes will be created based on their position on the WRWC Segment W24 Leaderboard following the final points audit on April 18, 2024. Competition positions will be filled up to the number of available positions in each discipline as listed in this section of these ground rules during the event entry time period. Eligible athletes that enter during the event entry time period that are not placed into a competition position will be placed on the master event athlete list as an alternate in order of their WRWC W24 Leaderboard position.
- 6.3. WRWC reserves the right to award generic qualifications, in addition to and separate from the Qualifier Series events, to athletes from partner associations/events in any or all disciplines as it chooses. These generic qualifications and how they are awarded will be published and promoted upon confirmation.

6.4.1.5.1. Generic Qualifications vacated for any reason, including leaderboard qualification, will not be filled or replaced by alternate athletes.

6.5.1.3.1. #1 Athlete/Team – WRWC Showdown Round

6.5.1.3.1.1. Seeded athletes/teams are eligible to participate in the Qualifying Rounds for prize money, World points and AAC points. Seeded athletes/teams are eligible to advance to subsequent rounds of competition.

6.5.1.3.1.1.1. If a seeded athlete/team earns an advancement position into a competition round that the athlete/team is previously seeded, the advancement position will be vacated, and the next eligible athlete/team from the advancement criteria (fast time or aggregate) will advance.

6.5.1.3.1.1.2. If a seeded athlete/team earns an advancement position into a competition round that the athlete/team is not seeded into, the seeded athlete/team has the option to opt out of participating in that round of competition without penalty or jeopardizing their seeded competition position. The athlete/team must notify the event secretary with 30 minutes of the conclusion of the previous round if they intend to opt out of the advancement round. The vacated advancement position will be replaced by the next eligible athlete/team from the advancement criteria for the competition position vacated (fast time or aggregate).

6.5.2.2.1.1. Seeded athletes/teams are eligible to participate in the Qualifying Rounds for prize money, World points and AAC points. Seeded athletes/teams are eligible to advance to subsequent rounds of competition.

6.5.2.2.1.1.1. If a seeded athlete/team earns an advancement position into a competition round that the athlete/team is previously seeded, the advancement position will be vacated, and the next eligible athlete/team from the advancement criteria (fast time or aggregate) will advance.

6.5.2.2.1.1.2. If a seeded athlete/team earns an advancement position into a competition round that the athlete/team is not seeded into, the seeded athlete/team has the option to opt out of participating in that round of competition without penalty or jeopardizing their seeded competition position. The athlete/team must notify the event secretary with 30 minutes of the conclusion of the previous round if they intend to opt out of the advancement round. The vacated advancement position will be replaced by the next eligible athlete/team from the advancement criteria for the competition position vacated (fast time or aggregate).

## **8.2. TIE-BREAKERS IN QUALIFYING ROUNDS:**

8.2.1. If an advancing position is tied in the round for the last advancement position, ties creating the split up to one (1) place beyond the maximum advancement position will advance. Any ties creating a split more than one (1) place beyond the maximum advancement position will be dropped and not advance. If any advancement positions from the rounds are unfilled, an extra aggregate position will be added for advancement.

8.2.2. If any advancement positions from the aggregate are unfilled the remaining advancement positions will be filled by the next eligible athlete/team based on the W24 Leaderboard standings of the respective discipline with an unfilled position. (In Team Roping, it is based on the combined athletes' team points).

- 14.1. In the case of not having enough times in an event discipline, there will be ground money.
- 14.2. The definition of ground money is unclaimed prize money by go round that will be divided evenly between the athletes with qualified times within that same round of competition within the respective discipline.
- 14.3. If there are no qualified runs or times within a round, no ground money will be paid out.

#### 15. WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

- 15.1. World Championships in the Breakaway Roping, Team Roping Header, Team Roping Heeler, and Barrel Racing disciplines will be awarded separately for the W24 PRO Leaderboard and W24 Challenger Leaderboard.
  - 15.1.1. Athletes must enter and participate in the WRWC event to be eligible to earn the World Champion Bonus. If the Segment Leaderboard #1 athlete does not enter and participate in the next athlete with the highest cumulative World Points that enters and participates in the event will be named the World Champion.
  - 15.1.2. The World Championships for each discipline will be based on the cumulative W24 standings leaderboard with each WRWC World Champion earning a \$5,000 bonus.
- 15.2. The All Around World Championship will be based on the cumulative W24 standings from the combined PRO and Challenger Leaderboards. The athlete with the most combined accumulated World Points in multiple disciplines will be named the WRWC All Around World Champion.



- 15.2.1. The WRWC All Around World Champion earning a \$20,000 bonus.
- 15.2.2. An athlete is eligible for the All Around World Championship and bonus if they earn a minimum of fifteen (15) VRQ "Competition" Points in more than one discipline on the combined W24 PRO/CHL Leaderboards prior to the close of Segment W24 on April 14, 2024.
- 15.3. Throughout Segment W24 (April 17, 2023 – April 14, 2024), Pro and Challenger athletes will accumulate points from their efforts in the Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) and those points earned will then be combined with the event World Points that will be awarded onsite for the WRWC Qualifying Rounds, Semi-Final Round and Aggregate.
- 15.3.1. The WRWC Showdown Round and WRWC Triple Crown of Rodeo Round are not included in the 2024 WRWC World Championships.
- 15.4. World Championship Tie-Breakers
- 15.4.1. Most World points earned from a combination of points from all four (4) disciplines
- 15.4.2. Most World points earned from a combination of points from at least three (3) disciplines
- 15.4.3. Most World points earned from a single discipline
- 15.4.4. Most money earned in the WRWC event
- 15.5. Event World Points Scale

#### 16. WRWC LAST CHANCE QUALIFIER:

##### 16.1. Eligible Athletes

16.1.1.1. The May 2024 Cowgirl Gathering will offer a WRWC package for all Pro and Challenger breakaway ropers, team ropers and barrel racers. The entry fee will be \$150 per discipline per entry. The WRWC package will include:

16.1.1.1.1. One W25 Nomination for the Open

16.1.1.1.2. One W25 Nomination for the WRWC Sidepot

16.1.1.1.3. W25 Qualifier Series generic qualification to the highest nominated Pro and Challenger in each discipline

16.1.1.1.4. Last Chance Qualification to the 2024 WRWC event will be awarded to Pros and Challengers not already qualified to the event based on total entries in each class. The total advancing positions will be based on total entries. (see chart below).

16.1.2. Athletes may enter the WRWC package the maximum number of times they are entered in the Cowgirl Gathering. The highest placing Pro and Challenger not already competing in WRWC will advance.

##### 16.2. WRWC LAST CHANCE QUALIFIER ENTRY INFORMATION:

16.2.1. \$12,000 Added WRWC Side pot

16.2.1.1. Barrel Racing - \$3,000 (\$1,500 to Pros, \$1,500 to Challengers)

16.2.1.2. Breakaway Roping - \$3,000 (\$1,500 to Pros, \$1,500 to Challengers)

16.2.1.3. Team Roping - \$3,000 to Headers, \$3,000 to Heelers (\$1,500 to Pros, \$1,500 to Challengers)

16.2.2. Entries taken with Cowgirl Gathering entries

16.2.3. WRWC Package per discipline:

16.2.3.1. \$150 entry fee per discipline

16.2.3.1.1. Entry into WRWC side pot (side pot for Pro/Challenger athletes and paid back onsite, 100% payback of \$50)

16.2.3.1.2. Nomination into Cowgirl Gathering Open competition (\$75 value)

16.2.3.1.3. Nomination into WRWC side pot (\$25 value)

16.2.4. Turn outs will receive a full refund up to 72 hours prior to the event. Transaction fees are not included in any refunds.

16.2.4.1. Any turn out, doctor release or vet release received within 72 hours of the event start time will not be refunded.

16.3. **ADVANCEMENT PER LEADERBOARD** – up to 8 athletes per leaderboard advance to the WRWC based on total entries as described in the following advancement chart:

16.3.1. Barrel racing is based on the Open 5D results

16.3.2. Breakaway roping is based on the 3-head aggregate

16.3.3. Team roping is based on the 4-head aggregate

##### 16.4. TIE-BREAKERS IN LAST CHANCE QUALIFIER AND BUY BACK ROUNDS:

16.4.1. If an advancing position is tied in the aggregate for the last advancement position, ties creating the split up to one (1) place beyond the maximum advancement position will advance. Any ties creating a split more than one (1) place beyond the maximum advancement position will be dropped and not advance.

#### 17. 2025 WRWC Qualifier Series Event

17.1. The highest placing nominated Pro and Challenger in each discipline will earn a generic qualification into the 2025 WRWC event and double their nomination fee in prize money towards the WRWC Qualifier Series.
